



## Special Focus: Arab Teenagers

Arab teenagers are growing up in a confusing and tumultuous world. Their families and societies are frequently conservative, so they hardly find any room for open discussions on issues that are important to them. Lacking freedom of expression and without motivation to be creative, many Christian teens wonder about their future, and search for direction in a world dominated by Islam.

Each 28-minute episode of our new TV series, **Super Teens**, provides informative, innovative, entertaining and challenging advice that encourages Arab youth to live out their faith in the Arab world. The programs feature reports by and about Arab teens, testimonies of contemporary Christian singers and artists, advice for difficult situations, information about health and hygiene, and a 'Letters to God' section. And, as expected with this interactive generation, the young viewers are encouraged to share their own ideas and feelings on a range of important topics and issues they are dealing with.



### Missing in Action!

Working in the Arab World keeps us on our toes, especially when it comes to security concerns. We try to be wise in not taking unnecessary risks, but sometimes the unexpected happens.

One example of this happened last month at our distribution office. A hard drive was stolen from the main distribution computer. We do not know who stole it and why, but it had all our distribution data on it, so we are concerned about the security compromise much more than the cost of replacing it.

Pray for the protection of the information on it, as well as the ongoing protection of our offices, equipment and personnel.



According to a UNDP Report, one of twenty children is born with a disability or becomes disabled during childhood. There is every reason to assume that in the Arab World, with many families in poverty and affected by war and conflicts, the ratio of the handicapped is higher than that international average.

### The Rights of the Handicapped

In some Arab cultures, the negative attitudes from society are a big problem for the physically handicapped. There is a lack of understanding and knowledge of the needs they have; they are deemed a burden, with no contribution to society.

Arab Vision is producing a modern documentary-style TV program, comprising of 13 episodes, in which people with physical disabilities and their families narrate their own stories and experiences. The production stretches across six Arab countries – Egypt, Lebanon, Morocco, Syria, Yemen and the United Arab Emirates – in order to represent the whole region and appeal to the millions of Arab viewers throughout it.

The goal is to help tens of thousands of physically handicapped Arabs to understand and experience God's unconditional love and acceptance. Also, on a practical level, they - and the people working with them - will be encouraged through these programs to demand the implementation of their rights in the political domain and promote them in their societies. This reflects one of Arab Vision's core values of seeing just societies in the Arab World, in accordance to the Gospel, where the powerless and those with special needs are not marginalized nor abused.

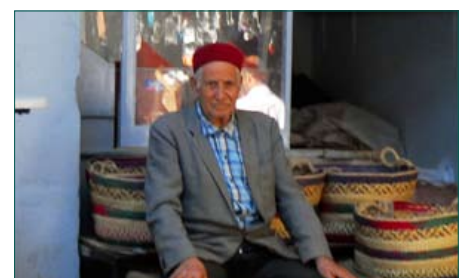
## BERBER PSALMS PROJECT

# Eyewitness reports from North Africa

REPORTS HAVE COME IN FROM OUR RESPONSE TEAM IN NORTH AFRICA INDICATING THAT MANY VIEWERS ARE RESPONDING TO THE GOSPEL. THE TEAM MEMBERS HAVE MET FACE-TO-FACE WITH THESE VIEWERS AND LISTENED TO THEIR STORIES.

## Imam and Family

The response team recently talked with an older man and his wife who were both very excited and even argued over who could hold the phone! They said they watch all the Christian satellite programs and believe everything they have heard. At first they didn't want to meet with anyone because the man said he was in a 'sensitive' position. Our team member on the phone thought the old man might be a police officer or have another government job.



Eventually the man confessed to being an imam, an Islamic religious leader. In fact, he had just returned home from leading the prayer at the mosque. Finally, after continued conversation, the couple asked for a visit.

He explained that all of his life he had taught in the mosque, but the truth of the Gospel touched his heart and brought repentance, especially when he saw how different the Bible's teachings were when it comes to the treatment and love a husband should have for his wife. He and his wife accepted Christ, and three of their children are also now Christians. With tears in his eyes he testified to his faith in Christ and explaining that he had no fear of dying. He talked of how good God is that He would allow such an old man to see the light of Christ.

When he was given a Bible, the old man became very emotional because he had never held one in his hands. He had only been able to hear parts of God's Word on TV.

## A Painter

What plans could God have in store for a 57-year-old house painter? Three years ago, he came across the Christian channel on satellite TV. Curious, he began watching regularly. The first year of watching, he was very negative and skeptical. The second year he began opening his heart. During this time, he worked for a national Christian family and was amazed by the love and kindness they showed him.



The third year, he was convinced of the truth of Christianity and gave his life to the Lord! When his wife first learned of his conversion, she was very upset. However, she became curious when he responded, "I can either marry three other women as Islam allows or I can faithfully love and serve you only, as the Bible teaches." She accepted Christ!

Then he went to the local religious leader and challenged him. After three years of intense study, he knew the answers that the imam could not answer. He has since shared about God's working in his life with many people, and he currently meets regularly to worship, pray, and learn with those who have decided to follow Christ. He has been baptized and now has baptized seven people himself. They all meet in his home for worship. Some of these new believers are also very boldly evangelizing others and desiring to start new churches in their homes.

## College Students

A college student began watching our Christian TV programs on satellite. She longed to know more, but was afraid to call. Would the police come? What would others think? She asked her roommate to call instead. Two Christians went to visit the young ladies. It turned out that the roommate herself had many problems and had never been satisfied with her religion. She worked in tourism and was emotionally broken because of the ways she had been badly treated and misused.



She felt she could never be forgiven. She couldn't see any value in her life. She didn't feel like her religion could help her. She wanted new life and hope. When she began reading the Bible, she was struck by Jesus' reaction to the woman caught in adultery. Her heart jumped! Could Jesus love her in this same way? She asked the visitors, "Is there hope for me?"

They began explaining about the broken relationship between God and man and how God had restored it. She learned that through Christ, she is a daughter of God! She was touched by the story of Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection. She realized that even if she had been the only one, Jesus would have died for her. Finally, one of them asked her, "Do you want this? He already died for you. It's done. And He's risen. Do you accept it?" Without hesitation, she replied, "Yes, how can I be saved?"

She accepted Christ's salvation. She has confessed her sins. She says that she has joy. She is like a burning candle now. She is free. Her burdens have been taken away! She does not know any other believers in her area. Her roommate is still interested in Christianity, as well as two other friends.

Last year, we visited countries in the Arab World, Europe and the USA. Around 80 episodes were produced and aired many times on a popular satellite station.

But it's not just about the numbers; viewers from all over the Arab World are testifying of the change God is bringing into their lives.
