### Vision and Mission

#### Vision Statement

We envision an Arab World with, in each people group, an increasing number of vibrant churches that play a strategic public role in shaping their societies in accordance with the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.



With the term 'Arab World' we mean the countries of the Arabian Peninsula, the Middle East and North Africa, where Arabic is the first official language of the state. We recognize that the Arab World consists of many different people groups, and we hold that these are entitled to hearing the Gospel in their own languages.

## Mission Statement

Arab Vision is a community of Christians committed to changing individuals and societies through the gospel of Jesus Christ, by producing and distributing effective Christian video programmes, using appropriate media for various target audiences in the languages of the peoples of the Arab World.



# **Productions and Training**

It is Arab Vision's goal to produce quality programmes that are thought-provoking and tailor made for different audiences.

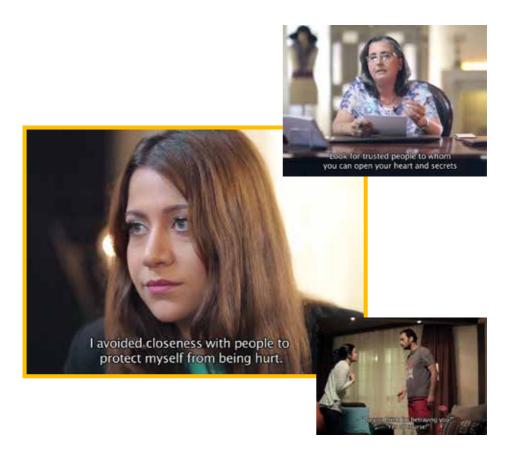
#### Productions in 2018 included:

❖ Easter Seasonal programme during Easter season. This year the theme for the series around Easter was "At the Cross"- seeking peace in a troubled world. Jesus Christ did not lead an army to convert any country. He never lifted a sword and the only crown he wore was the crown of thorns. He lived, died and rose from the dead to give us hope. He rose from the dead for our salvation. Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. The series consists of 10 x 20 minute episodes, with twenty special Easter songs and a short Bible message.





- Hope for Tomorrow II: Hope for Tomorrow had an enormous impact on social media and we received hundreds of questions, that is why we produced 22 short clips of each 3 min. in which Dr Amani answered those questions and communicated with the audience.

Mark my Words is a heart-warming series with children who share short Bible verses with the viewer. 365 short clips of 30-45 seconds. We also want to show through the children that everyone is valuable, that

is why about 5% of the verses are read by children with special needs. Some of the clips are in sign language or recited by blind children, using Braille. We have produced this series in Arabic and continue producing series with children speaking Kabyle (North-Africa) and Sourani (Kurdish). These clips are ideal for use

on social media, but they are also used by various satellite broadcasters. Watch several clips in <u>the playlist Presenting the</u> Gospel of our YouTube channel.





#### Christmas programme

"More than just Christmas" was the title of the concert we produced in cooperation with a worship band in Egypt. The concert was held in the open air in a public area in the heart to Cairo and it was aired on SAT-7. Watch several clips here.







Maaki V We have started the production of the fifth season of our very successful women testimonial programme Maaki (With you). This season will consist of 13 episodes with a focus on refugee women. Three episodes have been filmed and others are in process.



Light for North Africa - The Heritage Project, The Heritage Project is a series of 8 x 30 minute programmes depicting Christians who lived in the first five centuries AD. We hope that the series will be a great encouragement for the Christians in North Africa and an eye-opener to many who do not know the message of the Gospel. This project is being produced in partnership with International Media Ministries. Watch the trailer of this Heritage Project. In 2018 content for 6 episodes was filmed. My first words - is a literacy training programme for children who don't have access to schools and education, especially refugee children. We produce 56 episodes teaching the alphabet, numbers, colours, shapes and senses, using the peer to peer education method. A child draws and writes 3 or 4 different

objects and words, you can see the picture growing on screen, and the words written. Children also interview each other about the meaning of a word, like "what does it mean to have a house, a home?" We still need to do a small part of the editing and are looking forward to be able to provide the children with this excellent series.





Celebrating our faith Discipleship course for the Coptic Church, consisting of 8 episodes each 20-25 min. The material for the course is ready and we will soon film Pope Tawadros II of the Coptic Church who will provide an introduction to the series. The next step will be to train priests in El Qussia to teach the course (video and questions for group discussions) A pilot will then be run in 23 churches in this region. If necessary some changes will be made, after which the course can be used in all the Coptic parishes. We plan to subtitle the whole course in English, so it will also be excellent course material for use with migrants in Europe and other regions.



Various documentaries on social issues have been made, including on waste management, income generating projects and renovation of infrastructure.

# **Training**

We provided a workshop during 26 days of film making training for fresh graduates' journalists to turn their reports to video reports and to produce short movies about women and children.

## **Distribution**

In 2018 Arab Vision's programmes were aired on 5 satellite channels throughout the year and many programmes or parts of them were available on Facebook pages.

The total broadcast of new programmes

was around 66 hours, and the re-airing of programmes produced in the past year(s) added up to 291,5 hours.

Many of our new and older programmes are available on the internet through YouTube and as streaming videos on various websites. Through social media we are able to reach millions of people.







# Follow Up



Arab Vision's follow up team consists of 10 people and has its basis in the Middle East. The team is connected to other follow up teams in the region. Viewers of our TV programmes were able to reach a follow up worker 7 days per week, 10 hours per day.

The team attended a number of trainings to continue to develop itself in 2018. We did a training on counselling fundamentals with Dr. Amany, a training about YouTube, Social Media fundamentals, and Chatbots. A number of team members have been taking courses on counselling throughout the year.

In 2018 we continued to use Facebook pages for posting short clips of many of our productions, and interacting with our viewers. In this way viewers are invited to interact with follow up workers, and with other viewers of the programmes.

Many people call or send messages to our team, asking for prayer; prayer for relatives who have problems, for greater faith, for healing, wisdom for raising the children, for relationships that have deteriorated, etc. Here are some statistics of our Facebook pages:

Marina got in touch with us and openly told us that she is working in the prostitution. We talked with her about the prostitutes mentioned in the Bible and that they were accepted and loved by the Lord Jesus. Marina accepted these words and decided to stop with her work in the prostitution. We have now referred her to a spiritual support group.



#### Feelings of loneliness

A young girl from Algeria (16) got in touch with us on our *Hope for Tomorrow* page. After her father's death she has been struggling with feelings of loneliness and worthlessness. She started to think about taking her own life. We spend much time in listening to her and supporting her in this difficult time.

#### **Deeply distressed**

Abraham from Egypt lost his wife and children in a car accident. He is distressed and sad because of his loss. We talked with him about the presence of God in our lives. He replied that he feels comforted speaking with us and is thankful for our answers to the questions he has.





#### Can you help me find a church?

## You are like brothers and sisters to me

Lina is an Algerian lady and she has questions about Christ. She feels sad and is afraid of death. After having talked to our follow-up team, she felt at peace and told us that we are like brothers and sisters to her. We sent a Bible to Lina and will continue to stay in touch with her.



#### **Good solutions**

Jihan wrote to us on our *Hope for tomorrow* Facebook page: "I really love this page because it changes a lot of misconceptions. My husband loves and respects me, but isn't able to get children. Some people advised us to get a divorce, but we don't want that. You offer good solutions and make people aware of the problems. May our Lord strengthen you to continue to solve the problems of many people."

#### Thank you for listening to me

Huda from Algeria is divorced and her son is very violent towards her. She got in touch with our follow-up team and together we tried to find out what the reasons could be for her son's violent behaviour and talked about ways to deal with him. At the end of the conversation she said: 'I thank you so much, this was really useful. Thank you for listening to me.'



#### How can I become a Christian?

Abdul Rahman from Morocco has been in touch with us for quite some time. He started out with questions about Christianity, soon he requested a Bible. Recently he asked how he could become a Christian. Now we are trying to connect him to a church in Morocco.

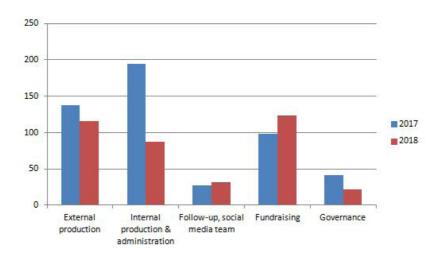

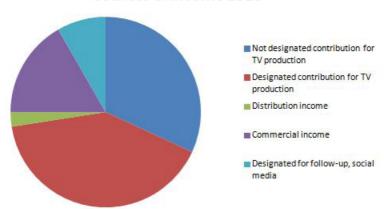

#### The Board of Arab Vision

In 2018 the International Board of Arab Vision met for 4 days: 2 days in March and 2 days in November. The Board Meetings in November marked the final stage of the Arab Vision Trust Fund as it was decided to terminate the Trust Fund, and continue the Arab Vision Ministry in the Netherlands, the UK and the USA.

In 2018 the International Board consisted of six Board members, from Lebanon, Egypt, USA and the Netherlands.

The AVTF board-members with an Arab background continued as members of a new, 'local board', in the Middle East.
